

Chapelfield Children's Day Nursery Ltd

Introduction

Chapelfield Children's Day Nursery Ltd is situated in Chapelfield Gardens near the centre of Norwich. The nursery is a purpose built provision and has been open since 1990. We are Ofsted registered (254014) for 52 children per day for children aged between 3 months and 5 years- up to the term after their 5th birthday.

Our aims and ethos

The nursery offers a safe and secure environment both indoors and outdoors in which children can freely explore and learn through a wide variety of play experiences. Within this happy environment, children can grow and develop to their full potential physically, socially, emotionally and intellectually. We promote positive behaviour and encourage children to respect each other and their surroundings.

Admission

It is important that you apply as early as possible for a place at Chapelfield Nursery. A place for your child is not guaranteed and a place becoming available depends on different factors (listed below.) We advise that you do not rely on the Nursery as your only plan of child care for when you require it.

The nursery operates a waiting list based on:

- > Staff children
- Existing Families including siblings
- Date of Receipt of Application
- > Availability of start date
- > Required sessions
- Age, to allow progression through the group rooms
- -If you would like to join the waiting list, please complete the enclosed application form and return it to the nursery.
- -Once you have completed and submitted the application form please allow 2 weeks for us to receive and register your details.
- -After this you may contact us to arrange an appointment to view the nursery and meet the staff team.
- -After the above the Children and Families Manager Stella will be in contact with you when a place becomes available or if we require an update of information.
- -Once a place is confirmed we will arrange an appointment with the management team to collate your details and arrange a meeting with the key person.

Opening times and sessions

We offer full day care Monday to Friday 8.15am – 6pm or a morning session 08.15 – 13.00 or an afternoon session 13.00 – 18.00. However our preschool room only is open from 8am if your child attends a morning session or full day. The nursery is open throughout the year with the exception of Bank Holidays, an annual staff-training day and the Christmas to New Year period.

Settling in period

The nursery operates a key/co person system. You will be invited to meet your child's key person to have an informal chat. This will enable the key person to get to know your child, their individual needs and development. A series of settling in visits will follow, gradually increasing the time you leave your child. This enables your child to become familiar and confident with their new surroundings and friends. Each child is an individual and will take his or her own time to settle.

Your child's key person will work closely with you to discuss the appropriate time scale for your child to happily settle. No charge is made for these visits, but for insurance purposes, you must stay on the nursery premises.

Security

The building has a finger print door entry system, therefore only allowing existing users of the nursery to enter. The nursery grounds and children's outdoor play areas are enclosed and are not over looked. All the staff are required to have an Enhanced Criminal Record Bureau check.

Parental Partnership

We pride ourselves on our friendly staff team and welcoming environment. We recognise the importance of parent input, and hope to work with you, discussing your child's development and achievements. The staff team will always be happy to share information and discuss your child's day.

Staff Team

Throughout the nursery we have a strong supportive team who all have a caring professional approach to all children, parents/carers, families and outside agencies. All the staff have been trained to a Level 3 qualification or above. Also some staff carry out additional training including Child Protection/Safe Guarding children, Early Years First Aid and Food Safety in Catering.

Provision

We have 4 group rooms within the nurseru:

Care Learning and Development

We implement and promote the statutory framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage from Every Child Matters. "Setting the Standards for Learning Development and Care for children from birth to five"

We aim to provide experiences and further opportunities based on children's interests and learning through play. The most important factor is for children to feel valued and secure within our fun and caring environment. The four group rooms in the nursery offer a wide variety of activities and play experiences, to enable your child to develop to their full potential.

<u>Jellybabes Room 3 months - 18 months (Approximate)</u>

Jellybabes provides a relaxed and loving atmosphere into which parents can feel assured that each child's key person we will work closely in partnership with you to provide the highest quality of care. The focus of this room is to be flexible ensuring every baby is nurtured with love and cuddles and their individual routines met. We liaise with parents/carers to establish a suitable routine to accommodate both home and nursery life.

We offer a range of activities both indoors and outdoors, which encourage and promote all round development, from music to relaxation and physical stimulation to social skills all of which will enable your child to reach their full potential both physically and emotionally.

The staff take great pride in offering not only a visually stimulating room with various mobiles and chimes, but also provides other forms of sensory exploration for example spaghetti play and body painting.

<u>Jellytots Room 1 year - 2 years (Approximate)</u>

Jellytots offers a gentle, friendly atmosphere based on warm and caring relationships between staff and children. The provision of this room is for six toddlers offering a variety of small group play to encourage many areas of development including personal, social and emotional progression. At the same time the staff enjoy observing and supporting each child's individual character blossom. As they develop and become more inquisitive we provide our toddlers with activities such as arts & craft, sand & water play by involving stimulating and educational resources.

The garden area aims to support the toddler's physical development but also incorporating many small world play activities, story areas and creative play under our covered area in all weathers.

Rainbow Room 2 - 3 years

In Rainbow Room we provide a cheerful environment into which children are welcomed. This room offers table top activities as well as a quieter comfy area for stories or relaxation. Creative and messy play is always great fun to explore with sand, water, cornflour and jelly. Also physical equipment is offered with challenging opportunities including obstacle courses, bikes, pushchairs and hoops.

As Personal, Social and Emotional development continues to grow, children are encouraged to share by small group work and free flow play throughout the room. All the children have opportunities to reach their full potential in all areas of development at their own pace.

Children are encouraged with self care skills such as hand washing and toileting. Rainbow room staff will liaise and provide support for each family to help make the transition from nappies to potty or toilet as easy and as stress free as possible.

<u>Creepy Crawlies Room 3 - 5 years</u>

Creepy Crawlies is an exciting room with a range of play equipment available to help children develop an array of skills, and great care is taken to choose materials that will create an inspiring sensory experience. As well as toys, we use real life props, such as brushes and gardening tools, and small-world play to help build a child's imagination

and language skills. Construction play is also available to help children develop fine motor skills and problem solving.

Some activities we provide enable children to explore sounds and letters at their own pace and some also introduce children to mathematical language and concepts such as counting, sorting, matching, number and shape recognition. Sequencing is also introduced through fun games, activities, rhymes and everyday experiences.

Our wide range of equipment, indoors and out, promotes and develops all types of physical skills and our aim is for children to gain confidence and control over their movements from pencil/scissor control to riding a bike/scooter and use their space appropriately.

Our garden offers a variety of age appropriate equipment, with tricycles, and balance beams, as well as stimulating features and sensory play areas, such as secret tunnels, a sand pit, wildlife areas, storutelling areas and planting.

All transitions are supported to school by providing many activities which prepare them for change and a large emphasis is placed on the encouragement of independence and self care.

Nursery life enables children to gain confidence, promotes and develops self-esteem, independence and self care skills, encourages sharing, communication and cooperation. This is achieved through a wide range of activities and children are encouraged to extend their vocabulary, listen and respond to others, individually and as a group.

Toileting

We ask you to provide nappies or training pants for your child. If your child is ready for toilet training, the staff team will be happy to work closely with you and your child. We ask you to provide spare clothes, just in case! Potties and training seats are on offer at all times, and independence is encouraged.

Nursery provides baby wipes and we ask you to supply nappy cream if required.

Clothing

We provide a wide range of messy play at nursery both indoors and out. Although we provide aprons, we recommend that children wear clothes which will not cause upset if they become messy. There are many opportunities for outdoor play so the correct clothing is important for the different weather conditions. It is helpful if your child has at least one full change of clothes at nursery and each item is clearly labelled with his/her name.

Festivals and Celebrations

We acknowledge and celebrate important events in children's lives such as new babies, birthdays and holidays. Also we value each families own celebrations through varied experiences i.e. through music, dance, food and books.

Nursery trips and outings

When ratios allow we take the children on trips and outings i.e walks in the park, visit to the library, shops. The nursery will always give advance notice where extra costs are involved for larger trips, such as the zoo.

Sleep and Rest Times

Provision for sleep and rest time is accommodated throughout the nursery to meet individual requirements. Also each room has provision for a child to have a rest or quiet time.

Food/Snacks/Drinks

We have a full time cook on site to prepare lunch and tea. The menu is devised by a 'Be Healthy' group within the nursery who also include the parent's ideas and feedback. A seasonal menu is devised to ensure a healthy, balanced and nutritious diet requirements are met. We provide a hot meal at lunchtime and light meal for tea. Our meals are prepared from fresh ingredients.

All dietary needs are catered for and we offer a wide range of taste experiences for your child. If your child is weaning, we would ensure to work closely with you regarding your child's mealtime needs. Food is well presented, and meal times are a positive, social event for the children. Meal costs are inclusive of your sessional charge.

Water is available throughout the day. Milk is offered at snack times and tea time. At morning and afternoon snack a variety of fruits and savoury options are offered.

Sickness policy

Children should not attend the nursery if they are unwell. If your child has had sickness and/or diarrhoea, the nursery has a 48-hour exclusion policy, advised by Norfolk Environmental Health.

If your child becomes unwell during a session at nursery, a member of staff will contact the parent/carer to arrange for the child to be collected.

The nursery should be informed if your child a communicable infectious disease or illness confirmed by a GP.

We ask to be informed if your child is to be absent, at the earliest possible time.

The nursery can administer prescribed medication (including inhalers) if required. The bottle/container must be clearly labelled with child's details and administration information. All administered medication/creams needs written parent/carer consent.

Some of the staff team all have a basic first aid training certificate and the nursery has named First Aiders to deal with emergencies. In the event of a medical emergency, the nursery manager will assess the situation and take prompt action, accordingly.

Language/Behaviour policy

Our aim is to portray a positive code of practice where language is concerned. The type of language used is based on respect for the children as individuals and a group. Staff use positive praise at every opportunity. We respond to unacceptable behaviour in a calm manner. We talk with the child, and asking him/her to think about what they have done, using words/phrases in which they can relate to such as 'sad', 'how would you feel if'. The child becomes aware of the affect his/her actions and emotions have on others.

Collection of children

Prior to starting at the nursery, we ask all parent/carers to give details of anyone involved in the dropping off and collecting of their child and you will have an option to use a password if you chose. If someone who was unfamiliar to the nursery staff arrived to pick up your child, the nursery would NOT allow your child to leave. The nursery manager would contact the parent/carers to ensure that these were the legitimate arrangements.

Safequarding

At Chapelfield Children's Day Nursery we aim to provide an enabling environment where each child feels protected, safe and secure from significant harm or neglect. It is paramount to Chapelfield Children's Day Nursery that we safeguard and promote the welfare of all our children in our care.

We acknowledge that Safeguarding previously known as Child Protection can be a very emotive, thought provoking, sensitive, naturally concerning and a serious experience for all involved. We aim to work in partnership with Parent/Carers, however considering the child's welfare at all times. All of our staff team will remain professional, caring and sensitive and follow our main Safeguarding policy.

Fees

Nursery fees are structured as follows:

Fees are payable one month in advance. Invoices are sent out on (approximately) the 4th of the month, with payment due on 18th of the coming month. We have internet banking available and also accept cash, cheques (made payable to 'CCDN Ltd.' We accept many voucher schemes and are happy to set up new voucher companies if needed.

There is no charge for bank holidays, staff training days and the Christmas to New Year period, when the nursery closes. However you are still charged if your child is sick or you choose to take a holiday on your allocated sessions.

At Chapelfield we have a 'Deposit Retainer' System which consists of a £200.00 deposit which is needed before we are able to secure your child's nursery place. The 'deposit retainer agreement' will be emailed or posted out to you and we ask for it to be returned, signed with payment to be made within 2 weeks. Once this is received we can begin the meeting and settling in process. Your deposit will be returned in 2 stages, £100 to be taken off your first invoice and £100 to be returned at the end of your time at Nursery, as long as your child starts Nursery on their set date / month. If the start date is deferred into the next calendar month you would lose £100 of the deposit and then if you continue to defer the place any further you will lose the remaining £100. After this you may lose your nursery place altogether or your application form would be removed from the waiting list.

Early Education Funding

The nursery accepts the Local Education Authority Funding in the term after their third birthday. We will claim this on behalf of Parent/Carers when their child is eligible.
